This article is written while I'm at Bible camp with 4 of our Catechism classes youth. The story from Luke about Martha and Mary came up, and we discussed the nuances of Martha as being distracted & worried while Mary was sitting at the feet of Jesus, listening to him.

One of our youth quietly observed (but loud enough that I could hear) that Mary wasn't just sitting there doing nothing. To quote the youth, "she wasn't just lazzin', she was listening."

I don't know if you appreciate this as much as I do, but I've never heard that before about this story. Traditionally Martha gets our finger wagged in her direction while Mary's halo gets a bit more shine from us. However, in defense of Martha, Mary was just sitting there *appearing* to do nothing. Martha is zooming from one thing to the next to provide the hospitality that we would provide any guest in our home; Mary appears to be sitting there. Martha is preparing the coffee & tea and assembling the entiments; Mary appears to be sitting there.

In defense of Martha, she is hard at work and her voice is rightly heard.

In defense of Mary (from the voice of our camper), she wasn't doing nothing, she was learning.

How often have we rightly lodged a complaint about the seeming disproportionate effort put in by me while others are seemingly doing nothing? One word - plenty!

Prayer, worship, discernment, service, and active community all look very different. The metaphor to use here is the iceberg. What we see above the water of the iceberg is merely it's tip, but it's depths and breath is unknown until it's explored. In the times we've rightly voiced our concern, it's imperative that we learn as Martha that things are not always what we see on the surface. The person who refuses to sing the hymn; they're still praying. The person who didn't say, "and also with you"; they didn't hear. The person who skips passing the peace; they're too troubled having no peace to share.

It's not always nothing, but many times it's something not yet know to us.

## Mosquito Bite Prevention

This has been a very humid and rainy summer. Here are some things to keep in mind about preventing mosquito bites.

Mosquitoes bite day and night. They spread germs through bites that can make you sick. Prevent illness by protecting yourself and your family from mosquito bites. Use EPA-registered insect repellents with one of the following active ingredients. When used as directed, EPA-registered insect repellents are proven safe and effective, even for pregnant and breastfeeding women. Here are some recommended insect repellents:

- · DEET
- · Picaridin (known as KBR 3023 and icaridin outside the United States)
- · IR3535
- · Oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE)—A plant-derived ingredient
- · Para-menthane-diol (PMD)
- · 2-undecanone—A plant-derived ingredient

#### Tips for babies and children

- Dress your child in clothing that covers arms and legs.
- Cover strollers and baby carriers with mosquito netting.
- When using insect repellent on your child. Always follow label instructions.
- Do not use products containing OLE or PMD on children under 3 years old.
- · Do not apply repellent to a child's hands, eyes, mouth, cuts, or irritated skin.
- · Apply repellent onto your hands and then apply to a child's face.

#### Adults:

- · Always follow the product label instructions.
- · Reapply repellent as directed.
- · Do not apply repellent on the skin under clothing.
- · If you are using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and insect repellent second.

#### Wear protective clothing

- · Wear protective clothing to prevent mosquito bites.
- · Wear loose-fitting, long-sleeved shirts and pants.
- · Wear clothing and gear treated with permethrin.
- · Permethrin is an insecticide that kills or repels mosquitoes.
- · Permethrin-treated clothing provides protection after multiple washings.
- · Do not use permethrin products directly on skin.

#### Control mosquitoes indoors and outdoors

- · Use screens on windows and doors. Repair holes in screens to keep mosquitoes outdoors.
- · Use air conditioning, if available.
- · Stop mosquitoes from laying eggs in or near water.
- · Check for water-holding containers both indoors and outdoors.
- · Once a week, empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpot saucers, or trash containers.
